An aggregation switch is a network device that consolidates traffic from multiple access switches, wireless access points, or other edge devices and forwards it to core switches or routers. By bundling multiple network connections into a single high-bandwidth link, aggregation switches help. Core switches set up a CSS that functions as the core of the entire campus network to implement high network reliability and forwarding of a large amount of data.
