

Cable trays should be laid in a straight line



Overview

Ensure the installation of trays/ladders is neat and in a straight line. Expansion provision shall be provided at all the building expansion joints and the manufacturer's instructions for installation shall be followed. Cable Tray Spacing Standards for Installation and Safety

General Practice: Cables within the tray should be laid straight and orderly, avoiding crosses or overlaps, and should not protrude. All bends must be securely fastened.

In order to install the cable tray supports, first find the required elevation from the floor to the bottom of the cable tray and establish a level line with a laser or a nylon string.
