Structure of Fiber Optic Cables

A typical fiber optic cable consists of several layers:

- Core: The innermost part made of ultra-pure glass or plastic, where light travels. Its diameter determines whether the cable is single-mode or multimode .
- Cladding: Surrounds the core and reflects light back into it, ensuring minimal signal loss .
- Buffer Coating: Provides physical protection and prevents bending damage .
- Strengthening Fibers: Materials like Kevlar or gel-filled sleeves reinforce the cable and enhance durability .
- Outer Jacket: Protects the cable from environmental factors, including moisture and mechanical stress .
