

Color splicing sequence of telecommunications optical cables



Overview

The TIA-598 standard defines a specific 12-color sequence for identifying individual strands. How it scales: For cables with more than 12 fibers (e., 24, 48, 144), the sequence repeats. multimode at a glance, trace individual strands in a 144-fiber bundle, and avoid the critical error of mixing connector types. In the photos above, on the left is a 1728 fiber cable with color coded buffer tubes, in the center are (from the top) singlemode zipcord cable used for patchcords with each fiber color coded, and on the right, a yellow.
