Overview of Gigabit Optical Switches

Gigabit optical switches are network devices that enable high-speed 1 Gbps data transmission over fiber-optic cables. They are widely used in enterprise networks, data centers, and industrial applications to connect multiple network segments with minimal latency and high reliability . These switches often support both managed and unmanaged configurations, allowing for flexible deployment depending on network complexity.

Common Interface Standards

- SFP (Small Form-factor Pluggable): The most common interface for 1 Gbps optical ports, also called “mini-GBIC.” SFP modules are hot-swappable and support both 1000BASE-SX (multimode fiber, up to 550 meters) and 1000BASE-LX (singlemode fiber, up to 10 km) standards .
- GBIC (Gigabit Interface Converter): An older, larger module supporting 1 Gbps, mostly used in legacy switches. It uses SC connectors and has lower port density compared to SFP .
- Copper SFP (RJ45): Some SFP slots support 1 Gbps over Cat5e/Cat6 copper cabling for short-distance connections .
