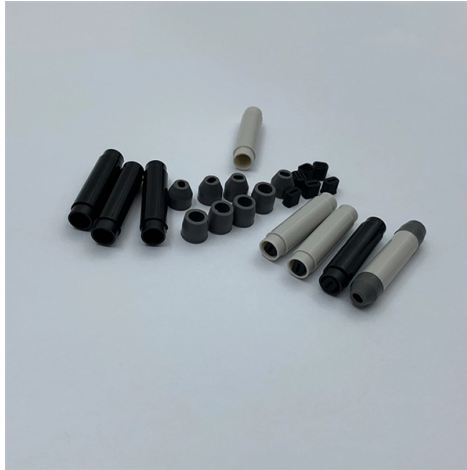


Distance requirements between cable trays and conduits

- Maintain sufficient clearance to allow inspection, maintenance, and safe access.
- Ensure mechanical protection for conduits carrying sensitive or high-voltage cables.
- Follow IEC 60364 and IEC 61537 standards, which provide guidance on cable segregation, mechanical protection, and tray/conduit layout to prevent overheating, mechanical damage, and EMI.
