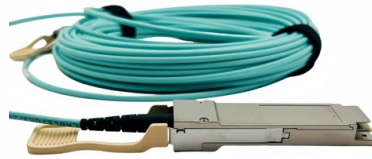


Do low-voltage cables need to be installed in cable trays

NEC Guidelines for Low-Voltage Cables

Cable trays are primarily a support system for electrical, power, signal, and communication cables, including low-voltage circuits such as Class 2 and Class 3 wiring, control circuits, and optical fiber cables (NEC Article 392) . According to NEC rules, low-voltage cables rated 600 volts or less can share a cable tray with other low-voltage cables without additional separation, provided the tray fill and support requirements are met . However, cables operating above 600 volts must either be metal-clad (Type MC) or separated by a solid barrier from lower-voltage cables .

Practical Considerations

While low-voltage cables are not strictly required to be in cable trays, using trays offers several advantages:

- **Organization and support:** Trays provide a structured pathway for routing multiple cables, making installation and maintenance easier .
- **Protection:** Solid-bottom or ventilated trays protect cables from physical damage, debris, or sagging, which is particularly useful in commercial or industrial environments .
