Modern fusion splicers use clad alignment, aligning the fiber cladding in a V-groove with camera-assisted precision . This method ensures minimal insertion loss and high return loss, making it ideal for backbone networks, data centers, and industrial applications . Fusion splicing is preferred over mechanical splicing for long-term reliability and performance.

- Pigtail Selection
- Choose single-mode pigtails for long-distance or backbone networks; multimode for short-distance or LAN applications .
