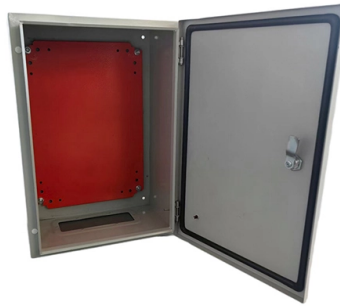

- **Ferrule:** Inside the connector is a 2.5mm cylindrical ferrule, typically made of ceramic or metal, which holds the fiber strand dead-center. This ferrule is critical for maintaining precise alignment between fiber cores.
- **Spring-Loaded Mating:** The connector incorporates a spring-loaded mechanism that maintains constant pressure on the ferrules, ensuring a stable connection even in environments with movement or vibration.
- **Signal Integrity:** The ST connector minimizes insertion loss and back reflection, preserving the integrity of the optical signal.
