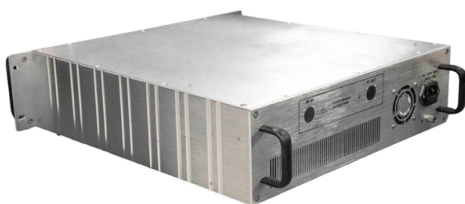

These boxes can have dozens of circuits, depending on the facility's electrical demand .

Factors Affecting Circuit Count

- **Electrical load:** The total current demand of all devices determines how many circuits are needed .
