

How much slack should be left when laying cables in cable trays



Overview

One foot of slack shall be left at each strain relief hook to insure proper loading of the hooks. Cat 6A cable will have enough slack to reach anywhere in. The excess is called a service loop and also called service slack, and we will use the terms interchangeably. Note that fiber optic cable and coaxial cable will typically follow similar rules for excess cable. What is a service loop in wiring?

Service loops are excess cable (slack) that is designed. Pull string shall be left in conduits, cable trays and cable hooks, after initial cable installation, to allow for future cabling needs.
