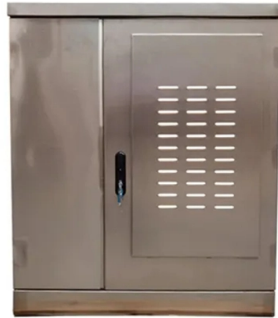


How to aggregate multiple broadband lines to a single switch

A standard network switch cannot directly combine multiple broadband ISP lines into a single faster internet connection; true aggregation requires specialized bonding hardware, software, or SD-WAN solutions.

Understanding Switch Aggregation vs Internet Bonding

Aggregation switches are designed to consolidate traffic from multiple access switches or devices into a single high-bandwidth link within a local network, typically using Link Aggregation Control Protocol (LACP) or static link aggregation. This increases LAN throughput, redundancy, and failover but only works for internal network traffic. It does not merge multiple ISP connections into a single internet pipe. For combining multiple broadband lines, the following approaches are used:

1. Load Balancing (Multi-WAN)

- A multi-WAN router or firewall can distribute traffic across multiple ISP connections.
- Techniques include Equal-Cost Multi-Path (ECMP), weighted round-robin, or per-VLAN routing.
- Pros: Improves overall network utilization and provides failover.
- Cons: Single TCP/UDP sessions cannot exceed the speed of one ISP; out-of-order packets may occur if lines have different speeds, affecting VOIP or streaming.
