

How to connect TX and FX to a terminal box



AI Overview

TX and FX signals can be connected to a terminal box using the appropriate terminal blocks, connectors, and wiring procedures while observing torque and interference precautions.

Connecting FX (Fiber Optic) Ports

FX ports typically use fiber-optic connections with MT-RJ connectors for multimode fiber (50/125 or 62.5/125 μm) or SC/ST connectors depending on the device . To connect FX to a terminal box:

- Select the correct fiber-optic patch cable that matches the port type (MT-RJ, SC, or ST) and the fiber type (multimode or single-mode) on both ends .
- Ensure the cable length does not exceed the maximum specified for reliable communication.
- Use mode-conditioning patch cords if connecting 1000BASE-LX/LH SFP modules to multimode fiber over distances greater than 300 meters .
- Insert the fiber connectors into the FX port on the device and the corresponding port on the terminal box or patch panel.
- Avoid bending the fiber sharply and keep it away from electrical cables to prevent signal loss or interference.
