- **Fill Ratio:** Cable trays should be filled to no more than 40% of their capacity to allow airflow and prevent overheating. This means at least 60% of the tray remains free for cooling and future cable additions ().
- **Tray Length:** Standard tray sections are typically 3 meters (10 feet) long, which balances ease of transport and installation ().
