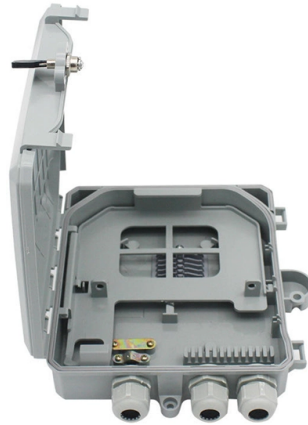


Meaning of numbers in optical fiber cable

- **Manufacturing and Model Information:** Numbers may include the cable model, serial number, and date of manufacture. For instance, "SR-5B9MR-864" identifies a specific Corning cable model, while a date like "01/2022" indicates when it was produced.
- **Performance and Specifications:** Certain numbers indicate technical specifications such as core/cladding diameter, minimum bend radius, pulling tension, or weight per unit length. These are critical for proper installation and handling.
