

No foreign objects allowed on cable trays



Overview

Due to their exposure to the open air because of the cable trays, the wires contained within need a very durable outer covering. The regulations dictate that the cables must either be Type TC (also known as Tray Rated) or must be metal-armored (Type MC). Grounding: Metallic trays can serve as equipment grounding conductors (EGC) if they meet NEC requirements. This is a description of how to select, install, and support these metal or plastic frames, on which electrical wires are installed.
