Intermediate Fiber Optic Links

Intermediate systems, such as the OFW-400 Intermediate Frequency (IF) Fiber Optic Interfacility Link (IFL), are designed to transmit signals over long distances using singlemode fiber optic cables. These systems can handle frequencies from 5 MHz to 300 MHz, with optional configurations extending up to 500 MHz, and standard transmission distances up to 50 km, extendable to 80 km. They provide low noise, high dynamic range, and are largely independent of the IF carrier's modulation format. Status monitoring, including laser bias, optical receive power, and temperature, is typically integrated via an onboard processor communicating with a host computer .

Intermediate Pulls in Optical Cable Installation

For very long outside plant (OSP) fiber runs exceeding approximately 2.5 miles (4 km), intermediate pulling points are often necessary. Techniques such as midspan pulls or using automated fiber pullers allow the cable to be installed continuously without excessive tension. A common method involves laying the cable in a “figure-8” pattern on the ground to prevent twisting and kinking. The cable is then attached to a pull rope with swivel pulling eyes and carefully pulled to the next location. This method ensures the cable maintains its integrity and avoids damage during installation .
