

Requirements for Installation of Fire Cable Trays in Basements



AI Overview

Fire-rated cable trays in basements must follow NEC and BS 7671 standards, ensuring proper material selection, fireproofing, grounding, clearances, and firestopping at penetrations.

Material and Tray Selection

- Indoor trays should be made of painted steel or galvanized steel, while corrosive or high-humidity environments may require aluminum alloy or fiberglass-reinforced plastic (FRP) trays .
- Tray width and thickness must support the weight and number of cables without deformation .
- Metallic trays can serve as equipment grounding conductors (EGC) if installed according to NEC requirements .

Cable Types and Separation

- Only use Tray Rated (Type TC) or Metal-Clad (Type MC) cables suitable for open-air exposure .
- High-voltage power cables and low-voltage signal cables must be routed separately to minimize electromagnetic interference .
- Fill limits: power cables $\leq 40\%$ of tray cross-section, control cables $\leq 50\%$.
