

Requirements for the length of electrical wires entering the distribution box



Overview

The NEC code of junction box requires at least 6 inches of free conductor length inside each box. Measure from where the wire comes out of the cable sheath or raceway. Having the correct amount of slack ensures that future maintenance, repairs, or device replacements can be performed without difficulty. According to the table: Section 314. 16 (B) (1) requires each conductor that originates outside the box and terminates or is spliced within the box to be. According to the NEC (National Electrical Code), all wire splices and electrical connections must be enclosed within an approved electrical junction box to ensure safety, accessibility, and code compliance.
