- Indoor use: NEMA 1 or IP20-IP30
- Outdoor or exposed areas: NEMA 4 or IP66 for water and dust resistance Materials include steel, stainless steel, plastic (ABS/polycarbonate), or fiberglass, each offering different levels of durability, corrosion resistance, and insulation . Ensure the enclosure size allows for proper air circulation and future expansion.
