

Splitter box pigtail connection method



Overview

This is accomplished by splicing the incoming hot wire (usually black) together with two short black pigtails using a wire nut. Each of these two pigtails then connects to one brass-colored terminal screw on the two individual switches, supplying continuous power to both devices.
