

The pigtail wire diameter is too thick and can't hold the wire properly



Overview

A thicker wire connected to a thinner one usually fails for one of three reasons: too much current, the wrong connector, or no strain relief. When any of those gaps slip into the splice, you can end up with a high-resistance joint that overheats, loosens, corrodes, or breaks. The pigtail method involves splicing the oversized wire to a shorter lead of a smaller gauge that matches the breaker's maximum terminal rating.
