In most cases, air distribution in data centers involves mixing of cooled air with air that has been heated by the IT equipment making it difficult to supply the cool air to where it is needed and resulting in inefficient heat transfer to the cooling system. Because air mixing occurs, the room has to be kept at an artificially low temperature. By introducing cold aisle architecture where the hot and cold air are separated, the supply. To do that, estimate the overall delta T (the average temperature rise of the air as it moves from the cold aisle, through the IT equipment, and out into the hot aisle).
