- **Configuration:** Single-phase or three-phase configurations, as well as radial or selective bus arrangements, influence the load distribution and maximum permissible load.
- **Safety Margins:** Adequate ventilation, insulation, and breaker protection are included to ensure safe operation at maximum load.
