

What size should the horizontal cable tray support be



Overview

For horizontal sections where cable trays are laid out in a straight line, the typical support span (distance between supports) should range from 1. This range allows for easy access and efficient maintenance. Hanging rod supports should be at least 8mm in diameter. Ensures vertical. Although BS 7671 touches on the subject of cable supports, it does not detail specifically what these support distances should be. 8 (Other Mechanical Stresses (A)) in that document provides requirements for cable support. The cable tray support span must be determined based on the manufacturer's load capacity chart and the total anticipated weight of the cables.
