

Why doesn't the router have a fiber optic connector

The Key Insight: Your normal router is not connected directly to the fiber line. It is connected to a device called an ONT — an Optical Network Terminal — which does the job of converting the light-based fiber signal into a standard Ethernet signal that your router can understand.
