

Wiring of AC contactor in distribution cabinet



AI Overview

AC contactors are wired by connecting the coil terminals (A1 and A2) to a control circuit and the main power lines (L1, L2, L3) to the load via T1, T2, T3, with auxiliary contacts and protective devices integrated for safe operation.

Coil (Control) Circuit

The coil terminals, labeled A1 and A2, receive the control voltage, which can be 24 V, 120 V, or 230 V AC depending on the contactor rating . Connect these terminals through a control line that includes a protection element (such as a fuse or circuit breaker) and a push-button module. Typically, a normally closed (NC) stop button is placed before the activation switch to allow immediate shutdown by breaking the coil voltage. A normally open (NO) auxiliary contact can be wired in parallel with the start button to maintain the contactor in an engaged state after the initial press .

Main Power Circuit

The main power lines enter the contactor through the upper terminals L1, L2, L3 and exit through T1, T2, T3 toward the load, such as a motor or compressor . This layout ensures clear phase distribution and simplifies maintenance checks. For three-phase motors, maintaining the correct phase order is critical to prevent reverse rotation. A thermal overload relay is typically installed between the output terminals and the motor input to protect against overcurrent; it interrupts the coil circuit rather than the main power, preventing overheating and extending the lifespan of the contactor .
